

Kennedy Center is Seeking Utilization

Do you have a talent you could share by teaching a one-day workshop or a long-term class? Are you part of an organization that's interested in raising funds by hosting a breakfast or other event? If so, the Kennedy Center may be the perfect venue for you!

The Center is available for rent—for classes, fund raisers, club meetings, and other activities. In fact, the Center is actively seeking non-profits and community groups to host breakfasts in the building on Saturdays, beginning in November until spring, during which time the Café 75 will be closed. (The Baking Brigade has already signed up to offer breakfast and a bake sale on the second Saturday of each month, but all other dates are wide open.)

Groups may sign up to host one breakfast or several. They may cook whatever they choose, determine their own prices, and set their own hours. Of course, all proceeds will go to the non-profit or community group, although a \$50* rental fee will be charged by the Center to cover the cost of propane, water, and electricity, as well as the use of dishes and dishwasher.

All food must be purchased and prepared by the group renting the space, and those groups are responsible for setup and cleanup. A \$50 deposit will be refunded after cleanup. Both the rental fee and deposit are required prior to the breakfast.

Since the Center's breakfasts have become fairly popular and boast a regular clientele, the host group is bound to make some money, particularly if the breakfast is widely promoted within the group as well as among its supporters and in the surrounding communities.

What if you aren't a non-profit or community group? What if you're an individual with a desire to teach art or dance or want to provide educational classes of some kind? Well, the Center may be just right for you too. For only \$50* (\$25 if you do not use the kitchen), you can rent the Center for an entire afternoon or evening. Again, you determine your class fees, provide supplies, manage registration, handle promotional considerations, and take care of setup and cleanup. (A \$50 deposit will still be required, but it will be returned upon cleanup.) And, once more, the rental fee and deposit are required before the class.

So, if you're hungry to make some money for your group or yourself, think about utilizing the Kennedy Community Center. And if you're ready to schedule an event, please call me at (651) 757-7567. We'd certainly like to see you here!
