KCC Students to Build a "Little Free Library" for Kennedy Community Center

The Hallock Public Library has been an area treasure for generations. It has promoted literacy and a love of reading through books and programs. Sometimes, however, patrons cannot make it to the library, and that's when a "Little Free Library" may be the answer. In fact, the folks at the Kennedy Community Center and the students in the Kittson Central Advanced Woodworking and Independent Shop classes are creating such a library, to be located just outside the Community Center. By doing so, they also are joining the national "Little Free Library" movement.

Little free libraries began springing up in Wisconsin in 2010. By January 2016, they numbered 36,000 nationwide. The idea behind them is simple: Provide a place where people can take a book or leave a book at no cost, day or night, 365 days a year. While some of these libraries are so small they sit on a single post and consist of only three or four feet of shelf space, others are as big as a backyard shed. And over the years, design has become almost as important as function, with these little libraries looking like everything from colorfully painted birdhouses to telephone booths.

After reviewing the Kennedy Community Center's wish list, which included a bench and twelve feet of shelf space to ensure room for children's books as well as adult fiction and nonfiction, the KCC students created a design that's aesthetically unique and pleasing while, at the same time, addresses the adverse weather conditions common to this region. Under the guidance of Ed Lehrke, their instructor, they then began construction, their plans consisting of a pair of enclosed and elevated, two-foot-wide by three-foot-high shelving units joined together by a bench with a roof that resembles a book lying open. The students hope to have the "Little Free Library" completed and installed by the end of the school year. (We will keep you posted.)

Once the "Little Free Library" is operational, it will be maintained by the Kennedy Community Center although anyone is welcome to leave books. In the meantime, if you would like to contribute financially to this project (although labor is free and books will be donated, we must pay for lumber, paint, and other supplies), make your check payable to:

City Council Appoints New Member

At the April 11, 2016, Kennedy City Council meeting, the council appointed Matt Casper to fill the open council seat. Casper will serve from April 11 through the end of the year and may seek re-appointment by running as a council candidate in the November 2016 election. Council members Cindy Urbaniak and Jon Pietruszewski are also up for re-election in November.

To be eligible as a Kennedy City Council candidate, an individual must be: a) eligible to vote; b) at least 21 years of age on or before January 9, 2017; and c) a resident of the City of Kennedy for 30 days prior to Tuesday, November 8, 2016.
