KENNEDY'S CITY COUNCIL HAS THREE OPEN SEATS THIS ELECTION

The Kennedy City Council has three council seats open for election this year. The term of each seat is four years.

To be eligible as a Kennedy City Council candidate an individual must be: a) eligible to vote; b) at least 21 years of age on or before January 7, 2017; and, c) have been a resident of the City of Kennedy for 20 days prior to Tuesday, November 8, 2016.



To file as a Kennedy City Council candidate, interested eligible individuals must: a) obtain an affidavit of candidacy from the Kennedy City Clerk, during city office hours, between the dates of August 2, 2016, and 5:00 p.m. on August 16, 2016; b) file a signed affidavit of candidacy with the Kennedy City Clerk, during city office hours, between the dates of August 2, 2016, and 5:00 p.m. on August 16, 2016; and, c) pay a \$2.00 filing fee.

Kennedy residents vote by mail. You will receive your ballots between 46 and 14 days prior to each the primary and the general election. However, the Kennedy City Council positions will appear on the general election ballot only.

Current council member Cindy Urbaniak will be up for re-election and appointed council members Jon Pietruszewski and Matt Casper will be up for election. These candidates may be challenged by any resident that adheres to the required steps to file as a Kennedy City Council candidate as described above. Kennedy voters will vote for three Kennedy City Council candidates on the ballot and the top three vote getters will win the open council seats.

Who can vote in Minnesota?

You must be:

- A U.S. citizen
- At least 18 years old on Election Day
- A resident of Minnesota, and a resident of Kennedy to vote in Kennedy's election, for 20 days
- Finished with all parts of any felony sentence
- You can vote while under guardianship unless a judge specifically has revoked your right to vote. (You cannot vote if a court has ruled that you are legally incompetent.)
- Registered to vote

To register to vote:

You may:

- Register online at (no spaces)
<https://mnvotes.sos.state.mn.us/VoterRegistration/VoterRegistrationMain.aspx>
- Register on paper by going to the Kittson County Auditor's office during regular office hours
 - 21 or more days prior to the primary election of August 9 or prior to the general election of November 8, 2016;
 - present valid and current ID; and,
 - request, complete, and return a voter registration card.
- Register on Election Day with one piece of proof of residence:
 - a valid and current ID, i.e., Minnesota driver's license, learner's permit or state ID; or a receipt for any of these;
 - U.S. Passport; U.S. Military or Veteran ID; Tribal ID with name, signature and photo; Minnesota university, college or technical college ID; Minnesota high school ID;
 - bill, account or start-of-service statement due or dated within 30 days of the election for phone, TV or internet, solid waste, sewer, electric, gas or water, banking or credit card, rent or mortgage, residential lease or rent agreement valid through Election Day, current student fee statement; or
 - a registered voter from your precinct can go with you to the polling place to sign an oath confirming your address. This is known as 'vouching.' A registered voter can vouch for up to eight voters. You cannot vouch for others if someone vouched for you.
